





Colegio Cristiano Presbiteriano provides pre-kindergarten through 11th grade classes for students from Barrio Hialeah, a neighborhood of families with very low incomes. The school offers a better education than that provided by the Nicaraguan public

schools and does so in a Christian setting; for example, an AWANA program is offered. Accomplishments of the school in 2018 include the following: The school offered a complete education by providing pre-kindergarten through 11th Grade (the last year in the

Nicaraguan school system) classes. The number of students served continues to increase in spite of economic hardships and political instability and averaged 317 students in 2018.
