a community on the outskirts of Managua, for many years. In 2019, Austin Samaritans worked with AMOS Health and Hope, managers of the clinic, to equip and help fund the operation of a dental care facility at the clinic. Highquality, affordable, and compassionate dental care is provided. Extensive COVID-19 prevention measures were put in place during 2020 to protect the health of staff and clients. Consequently, the dental clinic closed temporarily on only two occasions in 2020. During 2020 the clinic provided 365 individual dental procedures, including fillings, extractions, abscess drainage, and cleanings, to the low-income families in Nejapa.

In addition to implementing extensive COVID-19 prevention measures at the clinic, the clinic staff worked with its patient population to raise awareness about the importance of safety measures such as proper hand washing and the use of facial masks.

Austin Samaritans is the primary source of support for the clinic, which would close if not for that support.

The clinic was serving 5,987 registered patients at the end of 2020 and provided over 3000 consultations during the year.

The program typically provides breakfast and lunch each school day. For a while the breakfast program was discontinued, and the lunch program became a take-out. They also provided meals for some of the sick and elderly in the neighborhood during the pandemic. In mid-August, they began serving breakfast again. In spite of the challenges of the pandemic, they were able to add a fourth-grade class in 2020. They plan to add an additional class each year until education through the sixth grade can be provided.

Colegio Cristiano Presbiteriano (CCP) provides pre-kindergarten through high school classes for students from Barrio Hialeah, a neighborhood of families with very low income, and neighboring communities. The school offers a better education than that provided by the Nicaraguan public schools and does so in a Christian setting.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the school had to use take-home paper packets for lessons rather than in-person classes for part of the year. It also had to suspend the free lunch program for pre-school and elementary students for
